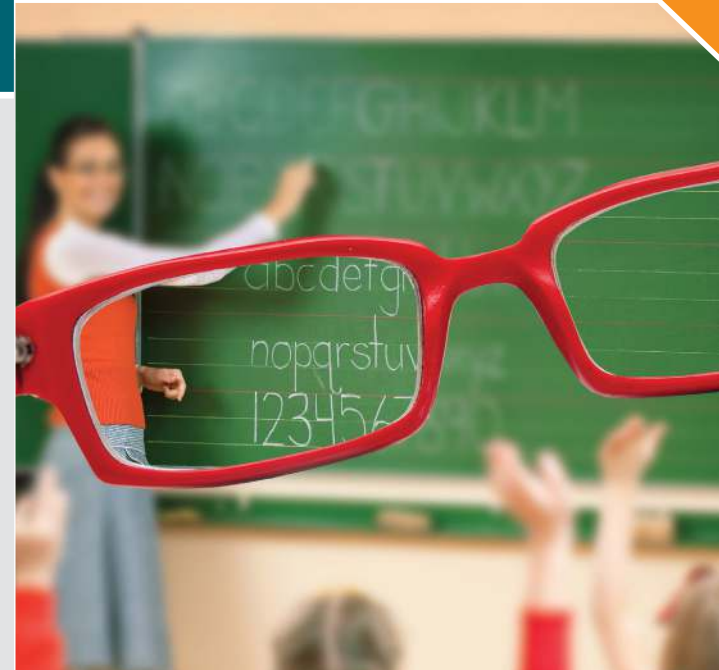

Eye See ... Eye Learn®

What is Eye See ... Eye Learn®?

Eye See ... Eye Learn® is a program that provides kindergarten students with a comprehensive eye exam from a participating B.C. doctor of optometry at no cost to the family. If needed, kindergarten students will also receive one pair of eyeglasses free of charge.

Good Vision = Better Learning

Good vision is an important part of learning. Did you know that...?

- Almost 25% of school-age children have vision problems?
- 80% of a child's learning is based on vision?
- Children rarely complain of vision problems since they don't realize that they see the world differently than others?
- Vision problems are often mistaken as other developmental problems like dyslexia or ADHD?

Vision Screen vs. Comprehensive Eye Exam

Some schools offer vision screenings. However, these are not a substitute for a comprehensive eye examination by a doctor of optometry since it involves only a limited number of simple tests that cannot detect all eye problems.

STEP 1 Check Your Eligibility
