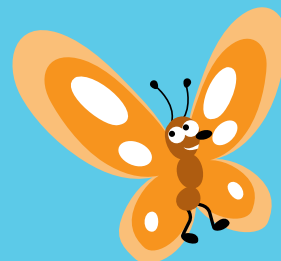
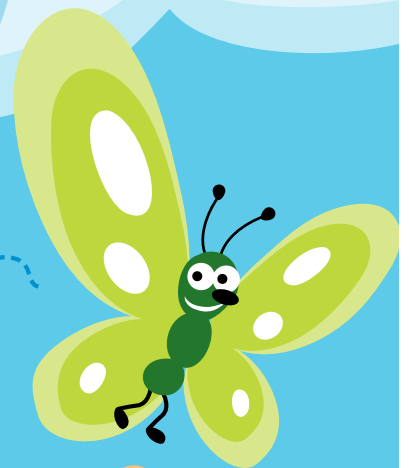
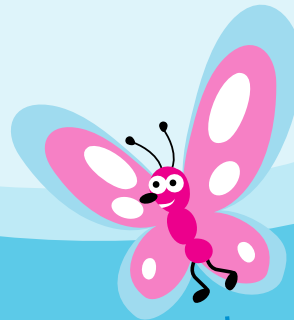
**One in five children has a vision disorder.** Not knowing any differently, many of these children accept poor vision and other eye problems as normal. The British Columbia Association of Optometrists (BCAO) created **a-b-See™** – a children's vision program – to help raise awareness among parents, teachers and kids that ALL children should have their first eye exam between six and nine months, and at least one eye exam between the ages of two and five, and yearly after starting school.

Ensure your child isn't hindered in learning, play or how they look at the world. Make an eye exam a regular part of your child's overall health. An eye doctor (optometrist or ophthalmologist) can complete this exam even if your child doesn't know how to read. Children's eye exams in B.C. are fully or partially covered by MSP.
